

Ski/Snowboard Race Venue Responsibilities

Sites/Venues

The venues listed are here are considered typical and are subject to change based on conditions, usage, and other variables.

Training sites include but are not limited to:

Upper and Lower Rams Head
Middle Fork

East Arena

A TASK STAFFING

- 1. <u>Task</u> staffing is the sole responsibility of the <u>Provider</u>, including but not limited to determining the number of workers required, the position that they will fill, and the training that they need to have/are provided with. A <u>list</u> of all event staff will be provided to MHM at or prior to the start of the event.
- 2. Course setting
 - a. Provider will provide a trained course setter to set the race course.
 - b. <u>Provider</u> will be solely responsible for the setting of the course.
- 3. Course maintenance
 - a. <u>Provider</u> will provide the necessary number of course maintenance personnel to maintain the race course throughout the duration of the <u>Task</u>.
 - b. <u>Provider</u> will be solely responsible for the maintenance of the course throughout the <u>Task</u> and will leave the venue in the best possible condition that manual course maintenance can provide.
- 4. Course officials

- a. <u>Provider</u> will provide the necessary number of course officials for score keeping/, timing, judging, and other race functions.
- b. <u>Provider</u> will be solely responsible for the scorekeeping communication and running of the <u>Task</u>.

5. Course tear down

- a. <u>Provider</u> will provide the necessary number of personnel to remove the course from the Venue.
- b. <u>Provider</u> will provide the necessary number of personnel to slip, rake, all ruts to a reasonable surface at the completion of the event

B VENUE CLOSURE/MAINTENANCE

1. Venue closure

a. <u>The Resort</u> will provide a venue which is closed to public at the top of the venue as well as along its length through the use of rope lines and signage. Any additional resources used to close the <u>Venue</u> shall be <u>the responsibility of the Provider</u>.

2. Hazard mitigation

- a. The responsibility of marking <u>man-made Resort</u> structures <u>within the Venue</u> will be the responsibility of <u>the Resort</u>.
- b. Mitigation of <u>naturally</u> occurring obstacles <u>and</u> conditions inside the venue <u>is</u> the responsibility of the <u>Provider</u>. <u>Any Resort</u> resources <u>used for this purpose will be set forth</u> in <u>Exhibit C</u>, <u>attached hereto</u>. <u>The Provider</u> is responsible for providing <u>any</u> additional mitigation resources.
- 3. The size and shape of the finish <u>corral</u> is the responsibility of the <u>Provider subject to the conditions set forth below.</u>
 - a. <u>The Resort</u> will provide materials for finish corrals as set forth in Exhibit C<u>, attached hereto.</u>
 - b. The finish corral should be of adequate size for the athletes to come to a complete stop inside the Venue. The finish corral shall connect to or overlap with the Venue closure <a href="mailto:soo that no one can enter the venue without encountering or violating the closure. The finish corral exit shall not allow anyone to pass through without first coming to a complete stop. If requested, Resort Race Crew staff may be made available to assist with the physical set up finish corrals.
 - c. It is the <u>Provider's responsibility to maintain the finish</u> corral <u>throughout</u> the <u>Task</u> period.

4. Spectators

- a. It is the <u>Provider's</u> responsibility to manage any gathering of spectators.
- b. <u>The Provider shall not permit</u> spectators <u>to</u> stop, stand or <u>gather</u> in <u>any</u> area where they may impede or obstruct <u>any</u> skier <u>or</u> snowboarder <u>traffic</u>.
- c. The Provider shall not permit uphill traffic.
- 5. Athletes outside the **Venue**

a. It is the <u>Provider's responsibility to enforce the Responsibility Code and the statutory duties of Oregon skiers at all times and to address any participant known to have violated the Responsibility Code or the statutory duties of skiers.</u>

6. Conduct/Ethics

a. The <u>Provider is</u> responsible for the conduct of <u>its</u> workers, volunteers, participants and spectators. <u>The Resort</u> encourages <u>the Provider</u> to have a written code of conduct and provide a copy to <u>the Resort</u>.
